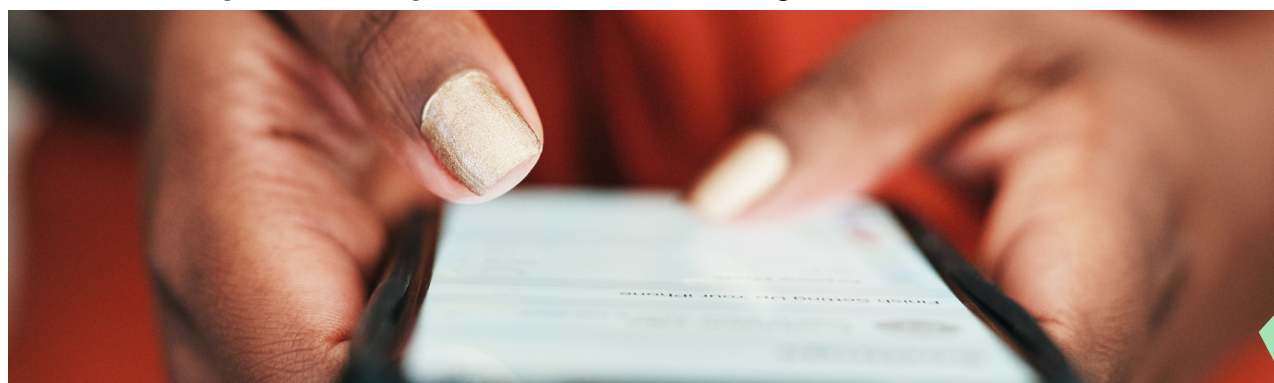

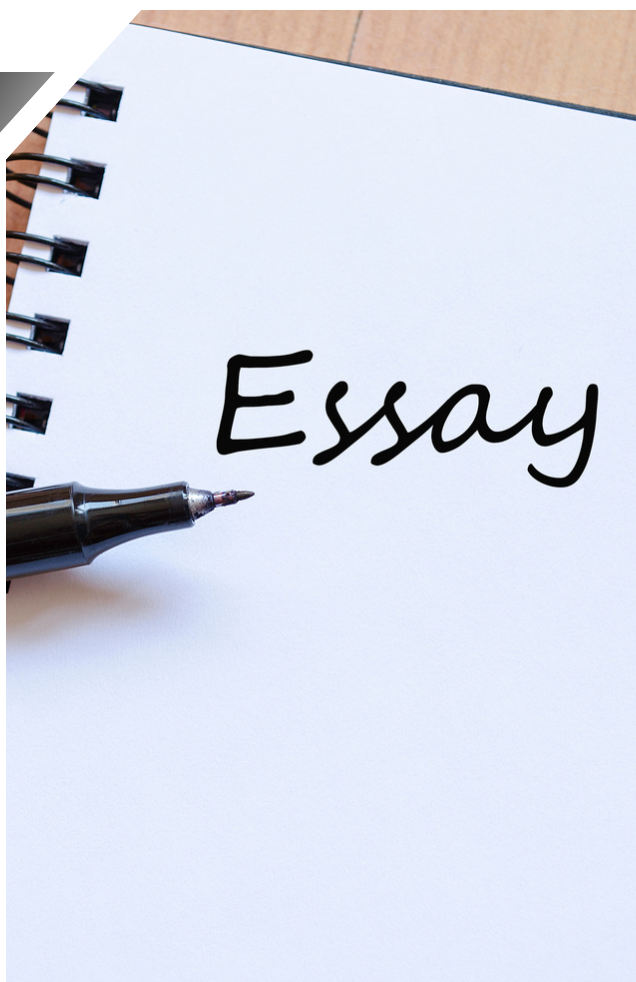
Submission to the Continental Level

Basic Essay Requirements *

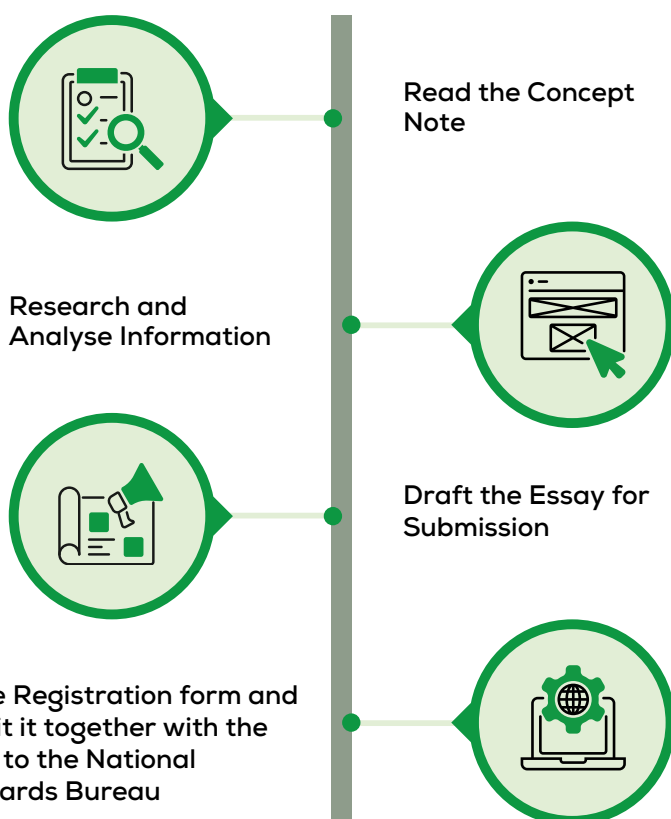
1. Length of essays : Essays should be between 1000 and 1200 words
2. Presentation: Essays should be double spaced and presented in Century Gothic, size 12
3. Language of essays: Essays must be submitted in English or French
4. Information on the author: Authors may use up to 50 words to describe themselves. Information should include their names, course and year of study, name, town and country in which their university is located.
N/B: this will not be part of the 1000- 1200 words
5. Contacts of authors: Authors should provide us with their postal, physical, telephone and email addresses on the first page of the essay together with the title of the essay and information on the author. Also kindly attach a copy of the Identity Card or Passport and a completely filled registration form
